Aaronic Priesthood Encampment

- Young men who will turn 12 years old in the same year of encampment may attend
- The Encampment begins at 8:00am on Thursday when we meet together at the GP Stake Center. Encampment ends around 4:00pm on Saturday when we arrive back at the GP Stake Center. Commit to coming and staying the entirety of the encampment.
- Bring your traditional paper scriptures to the encampment.
- All Encampment attendees whether or not they are members of the LDS Church, who come to the encampment must observe the Church's standards of personal conduct as set forth in the "For Strength of Youth" booklet.
- Young men and leaders should commit to attending encampment for the entire time. We invite those who need to leave early or arrive late to the encampment to provide written permission, prior to camp, to the Stake Encampment Director.
- No cell phones or other electronic devices will be permitted at the encampment. Leaders may use cell phones as needed.
- Gum is hazardous to the local wildlife. Please throw away in trash cans not on the ground.
- No feeding the wildlife!
- Package any food, snacks, or candy in plastic containers & do not leave it out! There is a problem with chipmunks and squirrels.
- Help keep your cabin clean by keeping your bunk organized.
- No graffiti, carving or painting on the walls or trees.
- No boys or adults should lie down or sleep in a bunk together.
- Activities and devotionals are NOT optional! Attend all of them and be on-time!
- Bring your medications in their original containers (including vitamins and over the counter meds) and check them in with the encampment medical staff.
- An adult must accompany all boys (not one-on-one) who are out of their cabins after 10:00pm.
- Your cabin leaders may provide appropriate music for your cabin; do not bring your own music.
- Be sure to use the can next to the toilet for trash, etc. Do not flush trash down toilets.
- Enjoy the dock and lake area only when a lifeguard is on duty.
- Dress modestly. Follow the guidelines in "For the Strength of Youth" booklet for appropriate clothing, swim and sleep wear. Swim shorts should be loose fitting, boxer-type for men and boys, and shirts must be worn when not at the water front. Shoes must be worn at the encampment.
- Coffee, Tea, Alcohol, tobacco, and illegal drugs are prohibited.
- Absolutely no fireworks are permitted at Church recreation camps, even for special events or holidays.
- Firearms, BB Guns, Paintball guns, air guns and other weapons are generally not permitted on the properties.

- Please refrain from foul language, as well as behavior that is not in harmony with the respectful atmosphere that should be maintained while at the encampment.
- No individual or cabin-sponsored activities may embarrass, humiliate, or endanger any other encampment participants. Have fun at the encampment, but never at the expense of others. Treat people the way you want to be treated.
- Please be courteous to other encampment attendees and neighboring residents by observing a noise curfew from 10:00pm to 7:00am.
- VISITORS All visitors, including parents, must receive prior approval from the Stake Encampment Director. All visitors must sign-in and out with the encampment medical staff, once at the encampment.
